The UTO is an international ministry of the Episcopal Church for the mission of the whole church. It was organized in 1871 by the Women's Auxiliary of the Board of Missions. Individuals set aside money throughout the year in thanksgiving for specific blessings and these gifts are brought to church on the designated In-Gathering Sunday to be blessed by the clergy. Grant requests made to the national church are evaluated and funded to provide ministry to men, women, and children through specific projects. The Diocese of Lexington has been the recipient of several of these grants throughout the years. The In-Gathering of donations at our Cathedral will occur once a year.
