

NEW LITURGICAL BANNERS CELEBRATE THE CHRISTIAN YEAR

An inspiring journey unfolds at Christ Church Cathedral with an exciting project from renowned liturgical artist Nancy Chinn. A series of banners inspired by scripture and infused with color symbolic of the liturgical seasons will soon make their way into the warmth and beauty of our worship space.



Chinn, who has more than 500 artistic installations to her credit, including important installations at Washington National Cathedral and Grace Cathedral in San Francisco, created a banner series for Christ Church Cathedral. Drawing on her signature style of bold design and saturated color, the artist created an abstract series of banners portraying the essence of the church seasons through dramatic use of color and movement. These beautiful banners invite worshipers to journey through the church year with their senses and experience God afresh through the ancient rhythms of faith.

The banner series, which seeks to inspire and add depth to our worship, was given to the glory of God and in memory of Ann Land Maury by her children. The first set of banners depicting the beautiful green growing season of Ordinary Time will be displayed in the worship space beginning on Sunday, October 2. May our journey through the Christian year accompanied by art and scripture inspire us to grow in faith.
